Spartanburg, SC:**

According to Hotwire.com’s Travel Value Index, the Greenville-Spartanburg area is ranked second in the USA behind Denver for offering the best value to travelers (based on airfare, hotel and car rental rates, plus availability of affordable attractions)! Our Convention & Visitor’s Bureau ([www.VisitSpartanburg.com](http://www.VisitSpartanburg.com)) has lots of general information that will be useful, but you can expect temperatures in the 50s - 70s during the day and 40s - 50s during the night in late April. Our last frost is April 15. We are located at the crossroads of I-85 (N/S) and I-26 (E/W). We are also at the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains (hence Blue Ridge Mountains) (hence the nickname “Piedmont”) and just 3-4 hours from the coast.

No fewer than 14 public gardens were affected by the severe hurricanes last year. Please help these gardens directly by visiting them and offering financial support if you can.

There are also major flower shows in America that are also part of AHS member benefits, and your AHS membership card gives you free or discounted admission to many of these shows which are some of the best places to experience the first burst of spring and collect ideas for the growing season too come.

The Members Guide is located at the insert pages: A1-A16, located between pages 32 and 33 of The American Gardener magazine.

This guide (p. A1-9) offers name, location, phone number, email address and admission information of gardens around the country. It also includes the 2006 Annual Seed Exchange located on pages A10-16, between pages 32 and 33 of the magazine.

The seeds are supplied from AHS gardeners across the country and they can be tried in your own garden or share the magic of life sprouting and growing with a child.

**DIANTHUS GRATIANOPOLITANUS** (Firewitch):

**Hardiness:** Grows well in USDA Hardiness Zones 3-9.

**Light:** Full sun.

**Soil:** Grows best in well-drained soils.

**Uses:** The cheddar pink is

excellent as a border edger, as a rock garden plant, planted in wall crevices, or as a ground cover on a sunny slope. It is at home in the herb garden or as a formal border or cottage garden.

**Planting Information:** Place dianthus in full sun locations or in light shade in extremely hot climates in well drained, neutral to slightly alkaline soil. Do not mulch with deep layers of organic matter. After flowering in late spring, the spent flower should be cut back to promote re-bloom later.

**Unique Qualities:** The enticing clove-like scent of this low-growing ornamental makes it the perfect choice for use in a border near the walkway. The blooms offer lingering fragrance. Placement near the walkway allows extra scent as people brush the fragrant blossoms. Pert, bright blooms make the Firewitch a perfect choice for the rock garden or for planting in wall crevices. The perennial quality creates a good ground cover on a sunny slope.

**Propagation:** Dianthus gratianopolitanus cultivars are propagated by tip and heel cuttings or division before or immediately after flowering. Dianthus species are propagated from seed in late winter to early spring.
